

Parque Regional Salinas y Arenales de San Pedro

El Parque Regional Salinas y Arenales de San Pedro del Pinatar fue declarado Espacio Natural en 1985. Debido a sus excepcionales valores naturales y culturales, está incluido en la lista de los Humedales de Importancia Internacional (Convenio RAMSAR) y es Zona de Especial Protección para las Aves (ZEPA), por lo que está dentro de la Red Natura 2000 de la Unión Europea.

The Regional Park Salinas y Arenales de San Pedro del Pinatar was declared Natural Reserve in 1985. Due to his high natural value, belongs to the Convention on Wetlands of International Importance (Ramsar Convention) and Special Protection Bird Area, being part of the European Natura 2000 Network.



Recomendaciones para los visitantes

El Parque reúne varios ecosistemas muy frágiles y delicados, como las dunas naturales, por lo que debemos transitar sólo por los senderos señalizados y pasarelas de acceso a las playas, para no dañar la vegetación y no molestar a la fauna. Está prohibido hacer fuego, acampar, llevar perros sueltos y aparcar fuera de los recintos autorizados.

Suggestions for the visitors

The natural reserve is a very fragile and delicate environment system, therefore keep in mind, follow the signposted trails and beach access walkways, do not step on the dunes and vegetation, do not disturb the birds. Make fire and camping are not allowed. Unleashed dogs and car park outside of the established parking sites are also prohibited.



El buen clima a lo largo de todo el año y la suavidad de los terrenos de San Pedro del Pinatar, hacen del Parque Regional un lugar idóneo para la práctica del senderismo y de la bicicleta por los senderos y cariles habilitados para ello.

Además, este espacio natural es un lugar indicado para la observación de numerosas aves acuáticas que viven o visitan los estanques salineros y su entorno.

Thanks to the nice weather throughout the year and the softness of the grounds of San Pedro del Pinatar, the Regional Park is an ideal place for hiking and bicycling on trails and lanes enabled for it.

In addition, this natural area is a recommended place for the observation of numerous aquatic birds living in or visiting the salt ponds and their surroundings.

SENDA DE LOS TARAY / TARAYS PATH

Tramo del GR-92 (Streich of GR-92)

Tipo/ Type: Lineal/ Linear

Distancia/ Distance: 1,3 Km

Tiempo estimado: 20' de marcha efectiva (sin paradas)

Estimated time: 20' approximated time of steady walking without stops

Inicio y final/ Start and end of the path/ El Mojón y Rotonda de los Flamencos (Flamingos' Roundabout) en Avenida del Puerto

Descripción del itinerario:

La Senda de "Los Tarays" va paralela al canal perimetral que protege las salinas cuya agua es menos salada que la de los estanques salineros. El taray es el árbol más común a lo largo del camino. Este canal es un lugar ideal para observar diferentes especies de aves como ánade azulón, cigüeñuela, gallineta, carricero y martín pescador.

Description of the route:

The Path of "The Tarays" runs parallel to the perimeter channel that protects the saltponds whose water is the less salty in the Regional Park. Tamarisk is the most common tree along the path. This canal is an ideal place to observe different species of birds such as mallard, black-winged stilt, moorhen, european reed warbler and kingfishers.

PR-MU 65) SENDERO DE LAS ENCAÑIZADAS / ENCAÑIZADAS TRAIL

Sendero de pequeño recorrido (PR) / Short distance route

Tipo /Type: Circular / Circular

Distancia/ Distance: 11,9 km

Tiempo estimado: 2 h 40' aprox. de marcha efectiva (sin paradas)

Estimated time: 2 h 40' approximated time of steady walking without stops

Inicio y final/ Start and end of the path: Centro de Visitantes "Las Salinas"

Descripción del itinerario:

Este sendero nos propone recorrer el Parque Regional casi en su totalidad, disfrutando de sus paisajes, a través de las marcas blanca y amarilla de pequeño recorrido.

El punto de partida es junto a la rotonda dedicada al flamenco de la Avda. del Puerto. Comenzamos en dirección al Pinar de Coterillo, caminando sobre la pasarela, a veces elevada sobre las charcas salineras hasta llegar a la Curva de la Culebra donde nos uniremos a la Senda de Coterillo para dirigirnos, en dirección sur y paralelos a la carretera bordeando el Pinar.

Estas charcas son de gran importancia para la conservación de las aves nidificantes, migratorias e invernantes.

Cruzaremos el aparcamiento y zona recreativa hasta llegar a la Estación de Acuicultura Marína Imida, cruzaremos la carretera para



GR-92 SENDERO DEL MEDITERRANEO / MEDITERRANEAN TRAIL

It runs through the 8 coastal towns with a total itinerary of 163 km from here along the boundary of the Regional Park of San Pedro del Pinatar to reach the boundary of the Regional Park Salinas y Arenales de San Pedro. We will walk alongside the riverside to the residential area and once it is over, we will take the Treplay's path on the left until getting to the roundabout, where we will cross the effort of the Alcineira, and will cross the Mediterranean coast of Spain and ends at the limit with Santagio de la Ribera.

The GR-92 "Mediterranean Trail" runs through the Mediterranean coast of Spain and ends at the limit with Santagio de la Ribera. It begins in San Pedro del Pinatar (beach of El Mojón) and ends at the limit with Santagio de la Ribera.

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
